Join us for four days on the farm and learn how to teach FOOD ED., a course about food and farming that empowers high school students to change the food system.

WHAT IS FOOD ED.?

Food Ed. is a unique semester- or year-long course that empowers high school students to decipher the complexity of the food system—in order to change it. The curriculum's interactive lessons explore food and its relationship to culture, the environment and power. It asks why food is meaningful, how food mediates our relationship to nature and the role that food plays in shaping inequality. Each lesson includes a Kitchen Lab extension that transforms the classroom in a hands-on exploration of farm-driven cuisine. Students prepare dishes that are grounded in the curriculum's key themes and learn to connect the choices they make as eaters to the challenges—and possibilities—of food-system change.

WHAT IS OUR TEACHER INSTITUTE?

The Food Ed. Teacher Institute combines discussions, teaching practice, tours, and hands-on learning activities-all in service of preparing you to pilot your very own Food Ed. classroom. The Food Ed. Teacher Institute is free of cost.

STONE BARNS CENTER WILL PROVIDE:

- Travel to and from your local airport to Stone Barns Center in Pocantico Hills, NY (reimbursement up to \$600)
- Lodging at a nearby hotel, transportation between the hotel and the farm, daily meals during the program, and a per diem for dinner (reimbursement up to \$100)
- Training in Food Ed., Stone Barns Center's food studies curriculum for high school students
- A year of coaching by Stone Barns Center educators

Teachers who complete the Food Ed. Teacher Institute are also eligible for a Kitchen Lab equipment grant, a kit with everything you need to transform your classroom into a teaching kitchen (with a value up to \$2500).

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY? HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS WHO:

- Are appointed to full-time classroom teaching in the 2019-2020 school year
- · Specialize in science, social studies, ELA, FACS, or culinary arts
- Are interested in piloting Food Ed. as a new course at their school
